Tween Trail Talk July 2005


The Nominating Committee comprised of Terry Hardwicke, Chair; Steve Knight; and Mary Mueller submitted the following nominations to the President for the Board of Directors of OCTA California/ Nevada Chapter on April 22, 2005 at the Symposium in Genoa, Nevada. At the general membership meeting the next day the 160 attendees voted to accept the candidates. They are Dave Hollecker of Reno, Nevada, Kathy Lewin of Carmichael, California, and Dr. Jay Stovall of Grass Valley, California.

Kathy was elected for her second term on the board. She was the co-chairman of the Genoa Symposium last April. Kathy will be remembered for helping to launch the Chapter Speaker's Bureau with John Krizek. She volunteered to head the northern bureau while she lived in Santa Rosa.



Dave Hollecker joined OCTA and the CA-NV Chapter in 1988. He has attended many of the national conventions in that time. In 1994 he helped get the '96 Elko convention started and in 2000 he joined Chuck Dodd in co-chairing the 2002 Reno convention. In 2002 he received OCTA's Distinguished Volunteer Award and in 2004 he was awarded a Certificate of Appreciation from national and from the chapter for his efforts in saving a portion of the Beckwourth Trail. Dave is an 18 year member of Trails West, Inc. and is currently serving his second year as president. Dave also serves on the Reno Historical Resources Commission.

When OCTA was established in 1982 Jay Stovall became a charter member. He has attended the majority of the national conventions and most of the chapter's symposiums. He considers them so worthwhile. Jay has been on many of the chapter field trips and tours which made him aware of the importance of preservation. He has studied the compendium report from the members of the committee, chaired by Curtis Grant board member. Jay hopes to help the president and the board to aid in the mission. He wrote "I will do all that is possible to aid our chapter to face the future with good feelings by everyone for what we are doing for an important era in our country's history." After 43 years of private practice as a children's eye specialist this retired person has found the time to volunteer on the board.






Tour New Almaden, see historic homes, the Mining Museum & a ride to Quicksilver Park on the hill.
